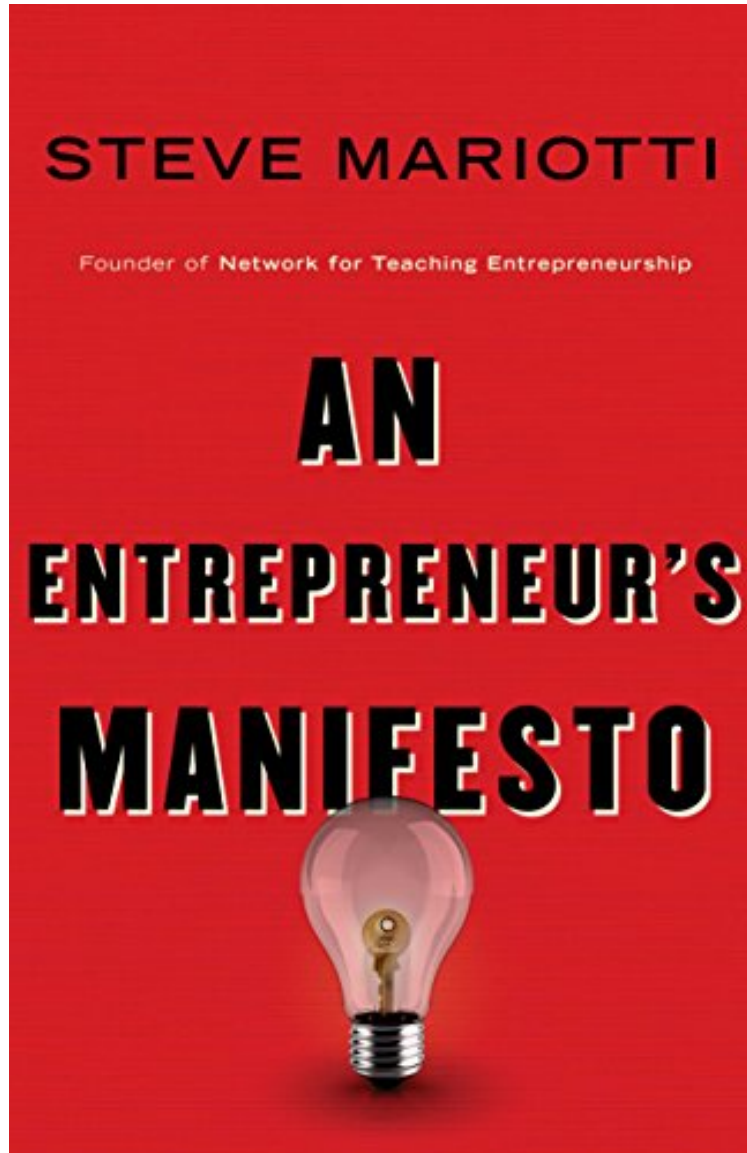

What an inspiring, thoughtful, ground-breaking book! Mariotti makes a clear-cut case for the power of entrepreneurship education and what he calls "the entrepreneurial mindset" to help lift people out of poverty around the world, and also encourage freedom and democracy to take root. I loved learning about attitudes toward entrepreneurship in different countries around the world and the many interviews with and stories about how people are using small business to battle hunger and violence ranging from building a homegrown seed industry in Africa to helping our own urban youth harness their amazing ideas and energy and blast out of the ghetto. Mariotti provides context by also including interviews with economists, stories of his own sometimes-hilarious experiences with thinkers as diverse as Friedrich Hayek, Milton Friedman and Ayn Rand, and a historic sense of the terrible things that have happened from Cambodia to the Soviet Union, when entrepreneurs are persecuted and oppressed. Through case studies, interviews, statistics and studies, as well as his personal anecdotes and journey from economist to entrepreneur to educator, Mariotti details convincing, if not irrefutable evidence of the revolutionary power of entrepreneurship.
