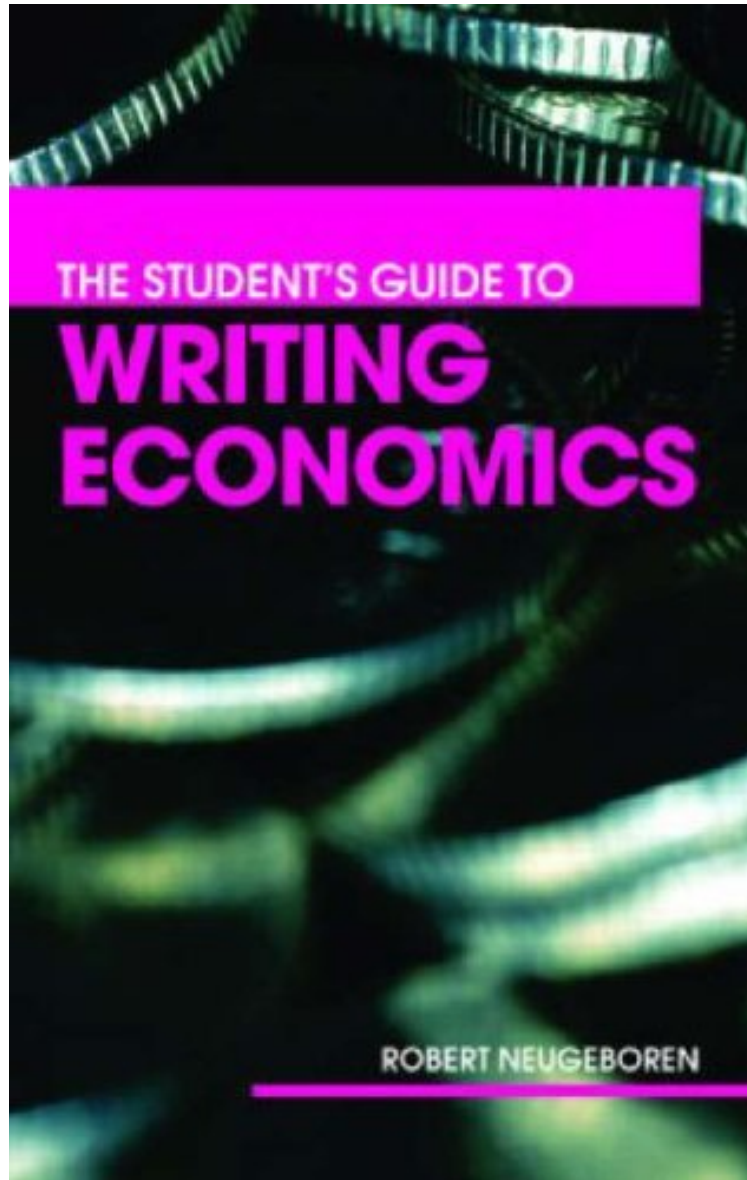

This book guides students through the means and methods of economics writing, by taking a step by step approach investigating: the keys needed to succeed as a writer of economics and an overview of the writing process from beginning to end; the basic methods economists use to analyze data and communicate their ideas; suggestions for finding and focusing one's topic, including standard economic sources and techniques for doing economic research; how to write papers; ways of citing sources and creating a bibliography. It also contains useful appendices, which provide details of statistical sources and relevant electronic indices.
